Walking Route to School, School Crossing Patrols, & Child Pedestrian Training Risk Assessments

Course Overview

A 1-to-2-day course providing an introduction to road safety risk assessment techniques and their application to Walking Routes to School, School Crossing Patrols, & Child Pedestrian Training sites.

The base course is a 1-day version that only covers Walking Routes to School. School Crossing Patrols and Child Pedestrian Training are each optional ½ day modules that can also be included, taking the full course to 2 days.

Aims and Objectives

The course will provide an overview of the process of risk assessment, and demonstrate the applicability of risk assessment techniques to road safety activities and to WRTS, SCP, & CPT sites in particular.

We will also review current national guidance and compare this with the local policies that are currently in place.
